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ENA Board of Directors Roles and Responsibilities

Each board member should:

- Conduct one-on-one calls in January with the presidents of your assigned states. This allows you to discuss any issues or special needs they may have as they begin their term.
- Join the state presidents listserv on the ENA Web site.
- Contact your state presidents and/or presidents-elect at least 8 times a year. Frequent communication builds a strong network between national and state levels.
- Seek input from the state presidents and/or presidents-elect about board agenda issues. This information is needed to help effectively represent the membership. Forward any potential agenda items/materials to Laura Peter and/or Renee Scaletta for future board meeting agendas. These will then be provided for review and approval by the president and/or executive director for inclusion on the next board meeting/teleconference agenda.
- Meet with state representatives at the Leadership and Annual Conferences.
- Set up an e-mail group for state presidents to help forward information easily and on a regular basis.
- Attend state meetings throughout the year. It is essential to understand how state councils operate and to learn what issues affect emergency nurses in that area.
 - ENA state conferences also include regional events such as the Southeastern Seaboard Symposium (SESS) and the New England Regional Symposium (NERS).
 - When there is a registration fee, the board liaison should contact the registrar to arrange for a complimentary registration.
 - The 2012 budget for state meeting trips will be approved during the 2011 December board of directors meeting.
- Going forward, the state presidents will be provided with some survey questions regarding their level of satisfaction with their board state liaisons. They will also be asked to provide any comments or suggestions for future improvements.
